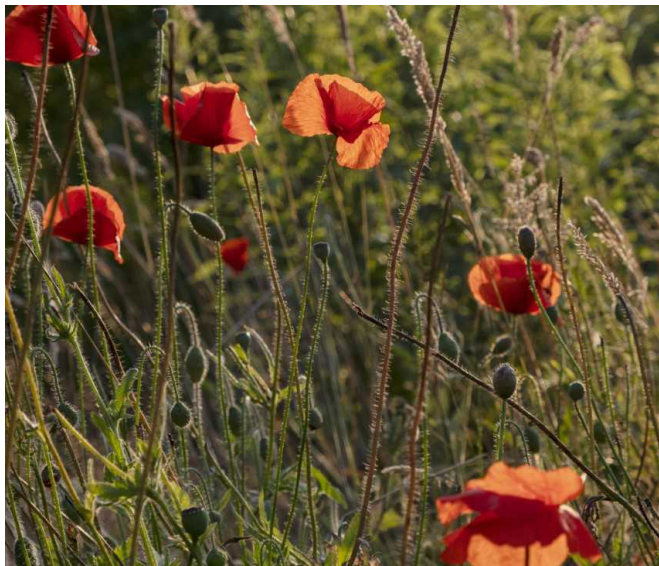


Welcome to a hybrid course where you will be able to participate either online from your home or physically at the Martinus Centre, Klint, Denmark. Why is marriage increasingly unstable? 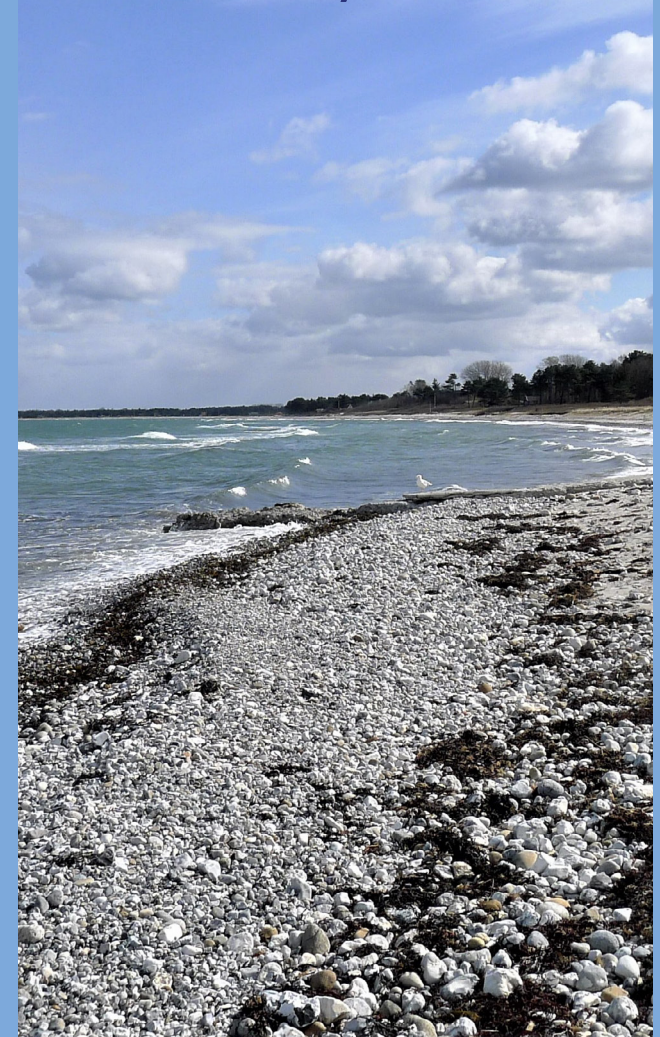
