Merry Christmas!

In this Christmas letter, we would like to tell you what has been going on in 2018 with Martinus' cause, both at the Martinus Institute and at the course centre in Klint. Thanks to generous gifts and legacies, we have been able to carry out a comprehensive renovation of the roof and masonry of the Martinus Institute. The windows were all given a coat of paint, both inside and outside. The attic windows were given new zinc cladding as the old cladding had started to corrode. In addition, Martinus' childhood home, Moskildvad, in North Jutland was given a new thatched roof. At the course centre in Klint we are looking into the possibility of improving the facilities for course participants.







In April, we announced in *Kosmos* that 500,000 DKK had been set aside for new, creative initiatives for the dissemination of Martinus' spiritual science. There have been many good suggestions that the Idea Group is going through.

On May 5th the Martinus Institute gave a reception in connection with the release of a new book in Danish and Swedish. It was Martinus' lecture series about the eternal world picture that had been transferred from audio format to text and has now been published as *The Grand Course*. The book has been warmly received. If you are interested in the book, you can as usual view or purchase it at the Martinus Institute, at the Martinus Centre, Klint or in our webshop.

Vegetarianism and veganism are gaining ground even in Denmark, which has otherwise had a strong tradition of "cultivating" animal products. At the course centre in Klint there was in September a three-day conference on food

for health in theory and practice, with food preparation in the centre's kitchen. There was also a conference on plant-based diet and health at the Martinus Institute. We were also represented with a lecture on the ideal food at San Francisco's vegetarian festival (see later in this letter).

Martinus has thoroughly explained in, among others books, *The Ideal Food* and *The Eternal World Picture* why it is best for human beings to eat plant-based

diets rather than animal products. In *The Eternal World Picture*, book 5, he explains this in Symbol No. 68 on "Stomach Acid, Cooking and Diet."

"[...] We will gradually arrive at a state in which many people will start to think about purer food. Vegetarianism is growing, and many people are beginning to see that it is healthier. It is also unpleasant to kill the animals; it is better to live from plant food. Many people become vegetarians for the sake of their own health, but at some point all people will have arrived at a stage where they will not eat meat because they will no longer be able to kill the animals. When it comes to the point where one knows that it is not vital for life to eat meat, that there is enough food besides meat, and that one cannot bear to kill animals, one will become a vegetarian. [...] "

An update on the teaching at the Martinus Centre, Klint and at the Martinus Institute

In relation to the teaching and dissemination of Martinus' analyses, our volunteer staff in the Teaching Group are working intensively to develop new forms of dissemination, while at the same time offering the usual variety of lectures, seminars, study groups and courses.

At the Martinus Institute we have had many good lectures, and the course centre at Klint has held courses continuously throughout the year, in addition to the great summer season, which only got better and better due to this year's fantastic summer weather. We can look back on a very inspiring summer season with weekly themes such as "Art and science" and "What is a human being?".

A news item this year is that the teachers have started Martinus Centre Klint Podcast, which you can find at: www.mcklint.dk/podcast/. Here you can listen to podcasts (so far only in Danish) about the history of the Martinus Centre, Klint, about the experiences of participants in the summer courses, reports on what it's like to be a volunteer at the Centre, as well as an account of Martinus' analysis of mental short-circuits. Several episodes of this new podcast from Klint will follow shortly, while our previous podcast episodes in English in the Martinus Cosmology Podcast and in the Swedish-Danish Kosmologipodden continue as before.

In the spring and the autumn we arranged two conferences on "Creativity, Art and Innovation" as well as "Plant-based Diet and Health". In addition, there was as always a wide range of lectures, seminars and courses at the Martinus Institute and the Martinus Centre, Klint, which offered both introductions for beginners and more in-depth courses for those who are already well into the work (e.g. weekly courses in *Livets Bog*, volume 5, with in-depth studies in the main subject "The highest fire – the transformation of our sexual poles").

The conversations on a theme at Café Klint are, as before, very popular and well-attended, and as a result, similar café conversations have now also been introduced at the Martinus Institute.

Something new for the coming year is that we are developing new forms of online education, also known as e-learning. This means that participants who take part in a course of meetings over several years at the Martinus Centre, Klint, where they immerse themselves in Martinus' work, will also have access to a learning platform with internet-based material in the form of, among other things, videos, study questions and podcasts. The course participants can thus keep in touch and immerse themselves in the work themselves between the meetings. In order to strengthen international dissemination, an entirely internet-based introductory course is also planned in English, where participants from all over the world can participate. A lecture tour to California

In September the Martinus Institute was represented at two conferences in the United States: the Science and Non-Duality Conference (SAND) 2018 in San José, October 26th, and The World Veg Festival 2018 in San Francisco the following day. Valve Zuercher-Valdespino was the initiator of the invitations. She is half Estonian and half Swiss, but spent her childhood and youth in Sweden, where she became interested in Martinus. She now lives in San Francisco. Our co-worker, Mary McGovern, met her during a lecture tour in Florida in 2016.

The theme of the SAND conference was "The Mystery of Being Human", and one of the main themes was "sex and gender". Mary therefore chose to lecture on *The Ongoing Evolution of Human Sexuality* – also because her translation of *Livets Bog (The Book of Life), Volume 5,* was published the week before the conference. There were approximately 70-80 participants at the lecture, and some had to stand because every seat was taken. There were more than 1400 participants at the whole conference, but there were many parallel lectures that people had to chose between. Mary's lecture was well received. There was also the opportunity to go more deeply into Martinus' worldview during lengthier conversations with the participants over meals and in the breaks.

The World Veg Festival in San Francisco the following day was a festive event with doctors, researchers, dieticians, animal rights' activists, vegetarian cooks and authors of vegetarian cookbooks. Their conclusion is that the evidence shows that we should eat a whole-grain vegan diet to optimise our health and cure a number of diseases. Mary gave a lecture about the ideal food to about 80 people. Here too some of the audience had to stand. There were three parallel activities throughout the day: a lecture in the large auditorium, which could accommodate several hundreds, a lecture in a smaller auditorium and a cooking demonstration in the third. The 30 copies of *The Ideal Food* that the Institute had sent over were eagerly snapped up. The participants were of many nationalities and of diverse ethnic backgrounds – a total of over 3,300 people.



Mary also gave a presentation of Martinus' worldview to a group of five women (two from Estonia, one from Sweden, one from Holland and one from the United States) at Valve's home.

It is difficult to assess the impact of such events. Time will tell. At least some small seeds have been sown in a large country.

We conclude this letter with an excerpt from the Christmas greeting that Martinus wrote in the December 1948 issue of *Kosmos*.

"The Christmas Gospel is nothing other than a message, a fairy tale from real life about God's radiant spirit, for all those who are walking in the darkness. It is the great light that shone over the world's first epochs of creation, and later down through all ages. It lit up the creation of Egypt's pyramids, it shone already in long-lost and forgotten times over India's temples and pagodas, and it overshadowed the terrains of China. It sparkled with an all-embracing brilliance from the mountains of Judea, and today its heavenly light concentrates in the midst of the Western countries' dark night of fate. In truth, its light is like 'the lightning that emanated from the East and that shines into the West'. The Spirit of God still moves over the waters. It smiles at us in the midwinter of our Nordic domains in the concept of 'Christmas atmosphere', and it expresses itself as warm, cordial handshakes accompanied by the wish for a 'Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year', as loving greetings, letters and gifts to relatives and friends, to the poor and distressed, to the homeless and lonely. It has made it a tradition that in the happy time of Christmas no one should go cold and hungry, no one should be homeless or abandoned. This loving Christmas atmosphere, or the warming light of this atmosphere, is the first faint glimmerings of the dawning of a new world epoch. It is the lasting 'Peace on Earth' of the Christmas gospel and the resulting goodwill toward human beings that is beginning to dawn."

With this greeting, we would like to thank all forces for good who work for Martinus' cause, our common cause.

Tax deduction for gifts

The Foundation Martinus Institute of Spiritual Science has been approved pursuant to §8A of The Danish Tax Assessment Act. This means that, if you reside in Denmark, you can get a tax deduction for monetary gifts. There is, however, a maximum amount for the gift deduction of 15,900 DKK per year (2018) and 16,300 DKK per year (2019).

Husbands and wives can each have their own deductions. In order to obtain deductions, you must provide your name and cpr number (Danish personal identification number).

We report monetary gifts to the Danish tax authorities, and the deduction will automatically appear in the section in your tax return called "Gifts to associations etc.".
